## 5. Water Supply Conditions Update & District Response

GM Salomone shared information provided on the same day by Sonoma Water Agency showing projections of Lake Mendocino storage based on varying levels of demand reduction and a discussion was held.

Devon Jones, Mendocino County Farm Bureau, asked what response from other stakeholders and/or the State Water Resources Control Board was expected and how much of the stated reservation amount would be allocated to agricultural use.

GM Salomone explained a drought management plan is being implemented by the District which includes the following: (1) Demand analysis with each customer to develop a diversion schedule specifying a date and time; (2) Reduction in diversion rates; and (3) Weekly meter read reporting and site visits. The District believes these practices will assist in stabilizing the river flow and potentially reduce the needed buffer on the minimum instream flow requirement. In addition, a five day running average for compliance on the minimum flow requirement was requested in Sonoma Water's recent Temporary Urgency Change Petition. It was clarified that the action to reserve a specific amount of stored water for the District's use in June through October does not guarantee that water will be available.

Trustee Reardan moved to approve Declaration #21-03 Stage IV Water Crisis. Vice President White seconded. The motion was approved by the following vote:
