In the above entitled cause Plaintiff MENDOCINO COUNTY
RUSSIAN RIVER FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION IMPROVEMENT
DISTRICT and Defendant REDWOOD VALLEY COUNTY WATER DISTRICT,
having stipulated through their respective counsel that
judgment be entered herein,

IT IS HEREBY ADJUDGED, ORDERED AND DECREED:

- 1. In this judgment plaintiff shall be referred to as "MENDOCINO" and defendant shall be referred to as "REDWOOD".
- 2. The parties hereto are now operating under the terms of a Memorandum of Guarantees of February 28, 1972, a copy of which is marked "Exhibit A" attached to the complaint on file herein, and an Interim Agreement of October

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14, 1972, a copy of which is marked "Exhibit B" attached to the complaint on file herein; that this judgment, upon becoming effective, shall supercede such Memorandum of Guarantees and such Interim Agreement, and they shall thereafter be inoperative.

3. MENDOCINO is entitled to 8,000 feet of water stored at Lake Mendocino pursuant to State Water Rights Board Decision D-1030. Surplus water referred to herein is that portion, if any, of said 8,000 acre feet which is not put to beneficial use within the lands/situated in the MENDOCINO district.

- 4. MENDOCINO shall sell to REDWOOD so much of such surplus water as REDWOOD desires to purchase, up to and including the entire amount of such surplus water, at a price and on terms as herein specified:
 - a. The purchase price of surplus water drawn by REDWOOD in the 1979-1980 fiscal year is Seven Dollars (\$7.00) per acre foot;
 - b. The purchase price of surplus water drawn in subsequent years shall be determined as follows: The cost of operation of MENDOCINO shall be divided by 8,000 acre feet (or such other sum as is reserved to MENDOCINO pursuant to State Water Rights Board Decision D-1030, or amendments thereto) to determine the cost of each acre foot. REDWOOD shall pay to MENDOCINO for all surplus water drawn at such cost per acre foot.
 - c. The cost of operation of MENDOCINO shall include annual bond interest and annual bond redemption

cost, ordinary administration and maintenance expenses
(based upon operations substantially the same in nature
and amount as the operations now conducted by MENDOCINO)
and such cost of operation shall not include any expenditures
for capital improvements or the operation of new capital
improvements, unless such capital improvements and
their operation provide a direct benefit to REDWOOD
proportional to REDWOOD's share of the water drawn.

- d. REDWOOD shall report to MENDOCINO at least once each month, and at such other reasonable times as MENDOCINO might require, the volume of water drawn by REDWOOD from Lake Mendocino. REDWOOD shall permit MENDOCINO to examine the meters located at the intake pumps upon notice and during normal business hours. REDWOOD consents to Pacific Gas and Electric Company furnishing to MENDOCINO, at MENDOCINO's sole cost and expense, information pertaining to electric power delivered by Pacific Gas and Electric Company to REDWOOD at its Lake Mendocino pumping plant.
- e. Payments shall be made by REDWOOD to MENDOCINO on August 1, 1980 for all surplus water drawn in the fiscal year 1979-1980; and, thereafter payments shall be made by REDWOOD to MENDOCINO on August 1 for all surplus water drawn in the preceding fiscal year. In the event of any disagreement as to the quantity of water drawn pursuant to this agreement, or as to the amount due, it shall be determined by arbitration as

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provided in Paragraph 7 hereof.

- 5. REDWOOD shall have the physical control of the taking of water from Lake Mendocino and shall bear all expenses of such taking, including but not limited to the furnishing and maintenance of intake facilities at the Lake, and shall abide by the rules and regulations of the Corps of Engineers in the installation and maintenance thereof.

 Provided, further, that REDWOOD shall hold MENDOCINO harmless from any and all liability for personal injury or property damage arising out of taking delivery of water hereunder and arising out of the operation of REDWOOD, unless such injury or damages caused are by the fault of MENDOCINO, its employees or agents.
 - 6. REDWOOD promises and agrees to pay to MENDOCINO:
 - a. A sum of money calculated pursuant to "Exhibit A" attached hereto, updated to July 1, 1980;
 - b. The sum of money so calculated shall be paid as soon as reasonably possible, but in no event later than July 1, 1983.
- 7. MENDOCINO shall notify REDWOOD in writing, at such time as no surplus water is available. If a disagreement exists as to the existence of surplus water, such disagreement within five (5) days after such notification by MENDOCINO to REDWOOD shall be referred to a board of three (3) arbitrators; one selected by MENDOCINO, one selected by REDWOOD, and a third selected by those two arbitrators, who shall be an engineer. The decision of the board of arbitrators shall be rendered in writing, signed by at least two (2) arbitrators,

within two (2) days after the appointment of the third arbitrator. This judgment shall be construed to be an order to arbitrate pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure, Section 1281.2; and, except as herein otherwise ordered, the arbitration shall be pursuant to the pertinent provisions of the California Code of Civil Procedure. At such time as it is determined by the arbitratory that no surplus water is available, REDWOOD shall cease to draw water which is a part of MENDOCINO's entitlement of 8,000 acre feet stored at Lake Mendocino.

- 8. At any time requested by REDWOOD, MENDOCINO will make application and do all things reasonably necessary to obtain water allocated to MENDOCINO under the 1969 Water Plan, or otherwise obtain water for the benefit of REDWOOD from the Warm Springs Project, or elsewhere, and REDWOOD will cooperate in all such applications and do all things necessary to accomplish the foregoing objectives.
 - a. If water so supplied for and obtained is used solely by REDWOOD, the reasonable cost of such applications, as they are incurred by MENDOCINO, and the cost of such water, shall be paid by REDWOOD to MENDOCINO. MENDOCINO shall make no additional charge to REDWOOD for such water. If the application is unsuccessful, the reasonable cost of such application shall be paid by REDWOOD to MENDOCINO.
 - b. If water so applied for and obtained by MENDOCINO is used by both MENDOCINO and REDWOOD, the cost of application and water shall be divided between

them in the same proportions as they shall use such water. If the application is unsuccessful, the reasonable cost of such application shall be equitably divided between them.

- c. The provisions of this paragraphs shall not apply to payments for surplus water as heretofore defined.
- 9. MENDOCINO and REDWOOD shall each use their best effort to effectuate a joint powers agreement or pool concept for the most effective utilization of the available water resources. Such joint powers agreement or pool concept may include MENDOCINO, REDWOOD, Marin Municipal Water District, North Marin County Water District, Sonoma County Water Agency, and other suitable agencies or entities.

 MENDOCINO and REDWOOD shall each extend to the other their full cooperation in creating such joint powers agreement or pool concept.
- 10. Except as to the provisions of Paragraphs 8 and 9, the terms of this agreement and judgment entered thereon shall apply solely to REDWOOD's purchase and withdrawal of surplus waters from MENDOCINO's 8,000 acre foot entitlement. It is recognized by the parties that REDWOOD now has, and may hereafter acquire, rights to withdraw other water from Lake Mendocino. Should any disagreements arise between the parties as to whether REDWOOD has withdrawn or is withdrawing surplus water, or water under other rights from Lake Mendocino, it shall be determined by arbitration as provided in Paragraph 7.

- 11. This judgment, and any action taken pursuant to this judgment, shall not make REDWOOD a part of MENDOCINO.
- 12. This judgment shall be effective forthwith and shall remain in full force and effect until either:
 - a. It is altered or amended or terminated by a written agreement between MENDOCINO and REDWOOD, which agreement specifically recites that it is intended to alter, amend or terminate this judgment;
 - b. Either party moves that the Court terminate the judgment insofar as it applies to surplus water on the grounds that no surplus water remains available for purchase and sale and the Court so finds and orders.
 - c. Either party moves that the Court terminate the remaining provisions of the judgment on the grounds that their purpose has been fulfilled and the Court so finds and orders.

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Agreement between the Redwood Valley County Water District and the Mendocino County Russian River Flood Control and Water Conservation Improvement District Altering and Amending Stipulated Judgment 42059

The Board of Directors of Redwood Valley County Water District (Redwood) through approval of Resolution No. 2010-1 has authorized President Don Butow to enter into a written agreement with the Mendocino County Russian River Flood Control and Water Conservation Improvement District (District). The Board of Trustees of the District through approval of Resolution No.10-03 have authorized President Lee Howard to enter into a written agreement with Redwood. The agreement alters and amends the 1980 Stipulated Judgment 42059 as follows:

- Section 4 b. shall be amended to allow the District to establish the purchase price for surplus water delivered in 2009 by dividing the cost of operations for 2009 by 4,000 AF. This amendment shall apply only to 2009. After establishing the cost for 2009 the method for establishing cost shall revert to the formula in the Judgment.
- Section 4 d. shall be altered to allow the District to examine the electrical meter located at the intake pump power transformer compound and in addition to examine the water meter located in the meter vault at the intersection of Road D and Colony Drive.

• Section 4 e. shall be altered to establish a water accounting year from January 1 through December 31 with a bill for water usage the previous year to be presented by the District to Redwood on February 1 of the following year.
