Water Supply Availability in the Russian River Watershed in 2022

Russian River curtailments continue to be suspended due to low demand and precipitation events.

Upper Russian River Water Sharing Program

The <u>Upper Russian River Water Sharing Program</u> has concluded for 2022. The first annual implementation report will be available soon and improvements are being made for a 2023 operational year, if needed. Eel River to Russian River diversions through Potter Valley Project: At

approximately 4 am on 12/27/22, Lake Pillsbury reservoir level reached 36,000 ÅF, therefore ending the variance. PG&E formally notified FERC later that day. Scott Dam release was increased and, as travel time allowed, East Branch Russian River minimum flow increased to 35 cfs plus buffer per the RPA, for a total of 45 cfs. No changes to E-11 flows have been made, as those flows were not changed by the variance.






Lake Mendocino Storage






Lake Pillsbury Storage and Target Storage Scenarios


